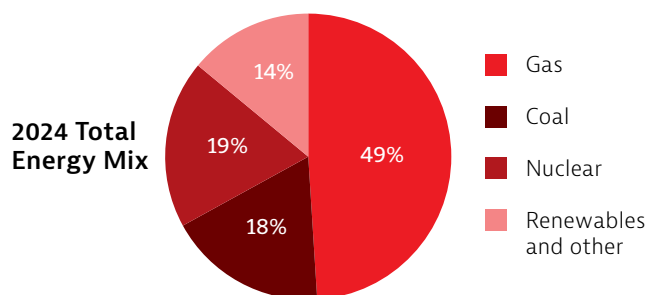

Electric Operating Companies

Three vertically integrated, state regulated electric utilities, serving 4.5 million customers and developing a diverse portfolio of generation resources including nuclear, renewables and natural gas – together with an emphasis on energy efficiency.



Southern Company Gas

A natural gas distribution system that includes four state-regulated local distribution companies (LDCs), serving 4.4 million customers. We have investments in five gas pipelines including Southern Natural Gas. Gas marketing services complement LDCs and pipeline investments.

Southern Power

America's premier wholesale energy partner investing in clean energy solutions for customers. Southern Power is a leading U.S. wholesale energy provider meeting the electricity needs of municipalities, electric cooperatives, investor-owned utilities and other energy customers.

PowerSecure

Provides energy technologies and services to electric utilities and their large industrial, commercial, institutional and municipal customers. Customer solutions include distributed generation systems, utility infrastructure solutions and energy efficiency products and services.

Net Zero Carbon Goal

We have set a goal to reduce greenhouse emissions by 50% from 2007 levels by 2030. 2024 emissions were 49% below 2007 levels. Achievement of these goals is dependent on various factors, including load growth across the Southern Company system's service territory, energy policy, natural gas prices and the pace of development of low- to no-GHG energy technologies.

We are an industry leader in conducting robust research, development and deployment of innovative energy technologies, including low- to no-GHG technologies. The company's R&D organization has a proven track record of technology advancement that dates back to the 1960s.

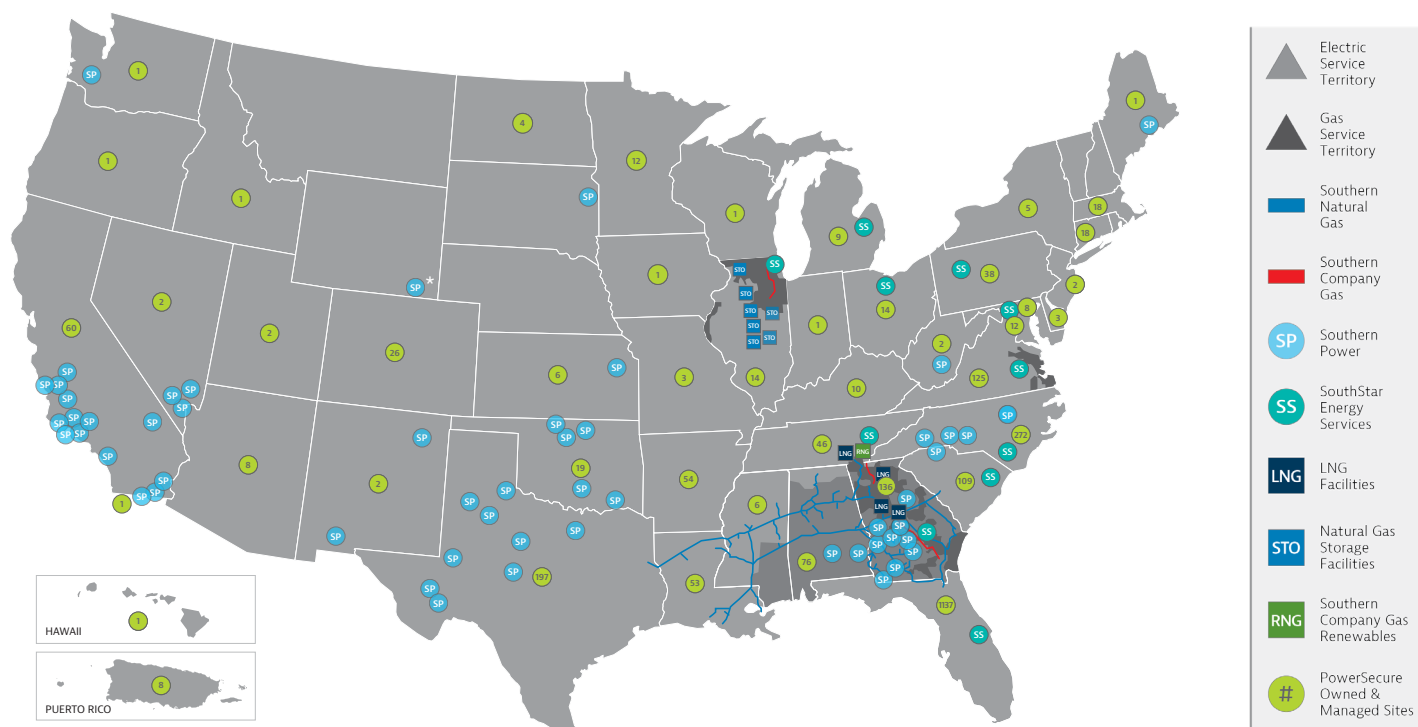
