Federal Power Act, 16 U.S.C. § 791a-825r

Sec. 3. The words defined in this section shall have the following meanings for purposes of this Act, to with:

'Corporation' means any corporation, joint-stock company, partnership, association, business trust, organized group of persons, whether incorporated or not, or a receiver or receivers, trustee or trustees of any of the foregoing. It shall not include 'municipalities, as hereinafter

'Person' means an individual or a corporation;

'Licensee, means any person, State, or municipality Licensed under the provisions of section 4 of this Act, and any assignee or successor in interest thereof;

'municipality means a city, county, irrigation district, drainage district, or other political subdivision or agency of a State competent under the Laws thereof to carry and the business of developing, transmitting, unitizing, or distributing power;

"project" means. a complete unit of improvement or development, consisting of a power house, all water conduits, all dams and appurtenant works and structures (including navigation structures) which are a part of said unit, and all storage, diverting, or fore bay reservoirs directly connected therewith, the primary line or lines transmitting power there from to the point of uncinon with the distribution system or with the interconnected primary transmission system, all miscasteria, system, all miscasteria, and all with the primary lines of way, ditches, dams, reservoirs, Lands, or interest in Lands the use and occupancy of which are necessary or appropriate in the maintenance and operation of such unit;

"Sec. 4. The Commission is hereby authorized and empowered

'To make investigations and to collect and record data concerning the utilization of the water 'resources of any region to be developed, the water-power industry and its relation to other industries and to interstate or foreign commerce, and concerning the location, capacity, development costs, and relation to markets of power sites; ... to the extent the Commission may deem necessary or useful for the purposes of this Act."

Every Licensee and every public utility shall file with the Commission such annual and other periodic or special* reports as the Commission may by rules and regulations or other prescribe as necessary or appropriate to assist the Commission in the proper administration of this Act. 1. ORGANIZATION, BASIS OF PRESENTATION AND SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES
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by PE, a wholly-owned subsidiary of FE, and 95% owned by PATH-Allegheny, PE's ownership in PATH Allegheny MD is reported as a noncontrolling interest

On November 6, 2021, FirstEnergy, along with FET, entered into the FET P&SA I, with Brookfield and the Brookfield would own 19.9% of the issued and outstanding membership interests of FET, for a purchase from FET, certain newly issued membership interests of FET, such that Brookfield would own 19.9% of the issued and outstanding membership interests of FET, for a purchase price of \$2.375 billion. The transaction closed on May 31, 2022. KATCo, which was a subsidiary of FET, became a wholly owned subsidiary of FET pior to the closing of the transaction.

Pursuant to the terms of the FET P&SA I, on May 31, 2022, Brookfield, FET and FE entered into the FET LLC Agreement, Brookfield is entitled to appoint a number of directors to the FET Board, in approximate proportion to Brookfield's ownership percentage in FET (rounded to the next whole number). The FET Board now consists of five directors, one appointed by Brookfield and four appointed by FE. The FET LLC Agreement contains certain investor protections, including, among other things, requiring Brookfield's approval for FET and its subsidiaries to take certain major actions. Under the terms of the FET LLC Agreement, for so long as Brookfield his a 9.9% interest in FET, Brookfield's consent is required for FET or any of its subsidiaries to incur indebtedness (other than the refinancing of existing indebtedness on commercially reasonable terms reflecting then-current credit market conditions) that would reasonably be expected to result in FET consolidated Debt-to-Capital Badio (as defined in the FET LLC Agreement) equaling or exceeding (i) prior to the fifth anniversary of the effective date, 65%, and (ii) thereafter, 70%. As discussed below, pursuant to the terms of the FET LLC Agreement.

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared in accordance with FERC accounting requirements as set forth in the Uniform System of Accounts and accounting releases, which differ from Generally Accepted Accounting Principles in the United States of America (GAAP). The significant differences between FERC and GAAP related to these financial statements include the following:

- Deferred income taxes are recorded on a gross basis on the FERC balance sheet with deferred tax assets and deferred tax liabilities being reported separately.
- For income statement purposes, there are differences in items included in Other Income and Other Income and Deductions under GAAP and FERC reporting, including costs which are recorded in operating expenses for GAAP and non-operating expenses for FERC.

Regulatory assets represent incurred costs that have been deferred because of their probable future recovery from customers through regulated rates. Regulatory liabilities represent amounts that are expected to be credited to customers through future regulated rates or amounts collected from customers for costs not vet incurred.

REVENUES AND RECEIVABLES

Under a formula rate mechanism approved by FERC, PATH-Allegheny is permitted to recover incurred costs (including amortization of the pre-rate implementation cost regulatory asset) and an allowed return. All prudently incurred allowable operation and maintenance expenses, a return earned on rate base and an income tax allowance are recoverable. PATH-Allegheny recognizes revenue as it incurs recoverable costs and earns the allowed return on a monthly basis. An initial rate filing based on estimated costs, is made for each calendar year and is used to determine customer charges, subject to a true-up mechanism to reconcile such estimates with actual costs prudently incurred. Any differences between revenues earned based on actual costs and the amounts billed based on estimated costs are recognized as a regulatory asset or liability and with the recovered or refunded, respectively, in subsequent periods.

All temporary cash investments purchased with an initial maturity of three months or less are reported as cash equivalents on the Balance Sheet at cost, which approximates their fair market value.

nic conditions following the global pandemic, have increased lead times across numerous material categories, with some as much as doubling from pre-pandemic lead times. In addition, pursuant to the FET P&SA II, FirstEnergy has agreed to make the necessary filings with the applicable regulatory authorities for the PA Consolidation. The FET Minority Equity Interest Sale is expected to close by early 2024. Upon closing, FET will continue to be consolidated in FirstEnergy's GAAP financial statements.

Under the Federal Power Act, FERC regulates rates for transmission of electric power, accounting and other matters. With respect to its transmission rates, PATH-Allegheny is subject to regulation by FERC.

in 2012, the PJM Board of Managers canceled the PATH Project, a proposed transmission line from West Virginia and into Maryland. As a result of PJM canceling the project, approximately \$52 million in costs incurred by PATH-Allegheny and PATH-WV, respectively, were reclassified from net property, plant and equipment to a regulatory asset for future recovery. FFRC Audit

FERC's Division of Audits and Accounting initiated a nonpublic audit of FESC in February 2019. Among other matters, the audit is evaluating FirstEnergy's compliance with certain accounting and reporting requirements under various FERC regulations. On February 4, 2022, FERC filed the final audit report for the period of January 1, 2015 through September 30, 2021, which included several findings and recommendations that FirstEnergy has accepted. The audit report included a finding and retain on FirstEnergy semblodology for allocation of certain corporate support costs to regulatory capital accounts under certain FERC regulations and reporting. Effective in the first quarter of 2022 and in response to the finding, FirstEnergy had implemented an ew methodology for the allocation of these corporates support costs to regulatory capital accounts for this regulatory capital editors. Such possible changes could impact FERC-iurisdictional rates, including transmission rates. On November 21, 2019, FERC issued a final rule (Order No. 864), Order No. 864 requires utilities with transmission formula rates to update their formula rate templates to include mechanisms to: (i) deduct any excess ADIT from or add any deficient ADIT to their rate base, (ii) raise or lower their income tax allowances by any amortized excess or deficient ADIT, and (iii) incorporate a new permanent worksheet into their rates that will annually track information related to excess or deficient ADIT. On June 1, 2020, PATH-Allegheny submitted for requested compliance filing. On May 4, 2021, FER C issued an order on PATH-Allegheny for proposed rate base adjustment mechanism, and PATH-Allegheny submitted the requested information on June 3, 2021. On April 27, 2022, FERC issued an order on PATH-Allegheny for partially complied with the requirements of Order No. 864 and directing part Allegheny submitted the compliance filing on June 27, 2022.

On March 20, 2020, FERC initiated a rulemaking proceeding on the transmission rate incentives provisions of Section 219 of the 2005 Energy Policy Act. FirstEnergy submitted comments through EEI and as part of a consortium of PJM Transmission Owners. In a supplemental rulemaking proceeding that was initiated on April 15, 2021, FERC requested comments on, among other things, whether to require utilities that have been members of an RTO for three years or more and that have been collecting an "RTO membership" ROE incentive adder to file tariff updates that would terminate collection of the incentive adder. Initial comments on the proposed rule were filed on June 25, 2021, and reply comments were filed on Juny 26, 2021. The rulemaking premise pending before FERC. FirstEnergy participated in comments on the supplemental rulemaking that were submitted by a group of PJM transmission owners and by various industry trade groups. 3. COMMITMENT, GUARANTEES AND CONTINGES

Various federal, state and local authorities regulate PATH-Allegheny with regard to air and water quality and other environmental matters. While PATH-Allegheny's environmental policies and procedures are designed to achieve compliance with applicable environmental laws and regulations, such laws and regulations are subject to periodic review and potential revision by the implementing agencies. PATH-Allegheny cannot predict the timing or ultimate outcome of any of these reviews or how any future actions taken as a result thereof may materially impact its business, results of operations, cash flows and financial condition

OTHER LEGAL PROCEEDINGS

United States v. Lamy Householder, et al

On July 21, 2020, a complaint and supporting affidavit containing federal criminal allegations were unsealed against the now former Ohio House Speaker Larry Householder and other individuals and entities allegedly affiliated with Mr. Householder. Also, on July 21, 2020, and in connection with the investigation, FirstEnergy received subpoenas for records from the U.S. Attorney's Office for the Southern District Ohio. FirstEnergy was not aware of the criminal allegations, affidavit or subpoenas before July 21, 2020.

On July 21, 2021, FE entered into a three-year DPA with the U.S. Altomey's Office that, subject to court proceedings, resolves this matter. Under the DPA, FE has agreed to the filling of a criminal information charging FE with one count of conspiracy to commit honest services were fraud. Legal Proceedings Relating to United States v. Larry Householder, et al.

On August 10, 2020, the SEC, through its Division of Enforcement, issued an order directing an investigation of possible securities laws violations by FE, and on September 1, 2020, issued subpoenas to FE and certain FE officers. On April 28, 2021, and July 11, 2022, the SEC issued additional subpoenas to FE, with which FE has compiled. While no contingency has been reflected in its consolidated financial statements, FE believes that it is probable that it will incur a loss in connection with the resolution of the SEC investigation.

In addition to the subpoenas referenced above under "—United States v. Larry Householder, et. at." and the SEC investigation, certain FE stockholders and FirstEnergy customers filed several lawsuits against FirstEnergy and certain current and former directors, officers and other employees, and the complaints in each of these suits is related to allegations in the complaint and supporting affidiant relating to HB 6 and the now former Ohio House Speaker Larry Householder, and other individuals and entities allegady on the subporting affidiant relating to HB 6 and the now former Ohio House Speaker Larry Householder, on contingency has been reflected in FirstEnergy's consolidated financial statements with respect to these lawsuits as a toss in entitle protoable, nor is a loss or range of a loss reasonably estimable.

In cases where PATH-Allegheny determines that it is not probable, but reasonably possible that it has a material obligation, it discloses such obligations and the possible loss or range of loss if such estimate can be made. If it were ultimately determined that PATH-Allegheny has legal liability or is otherwise made subject to liability, it could have a material adverse effect on PATH-Allegheny's financial condition, results of operations and cash flows.

5. INCENTIVE RATE DISCLOSURES

On February 29, 2008 FERC issued an Order Accepting And Suspending Formula Rates, Subject To Conditions, And Establishing Hearing and Settlement Procedure (February 29, 2008 Order), which approved PATH-Allegheny's request to include in rate base, 100 percent of its Construction Work in Progress (CWIP) prior to the in-service date of the project. This rate incentive allows PATH-Allegheny to earn a return on its investment in the project during the construction period, instead of being required to record Allowance for Funds Used During Construction (AFUDC) and wait until the project goes in service to begin earning a return.

These previously incurred costs were deferred (with carrying charges through February 29, 2008) and included in rate base effective March 1, 2008 to be amortized over the projected period for rightof-way acquisition and construction

The February 29, 2008 Order required specific accounting treatment to recognize the economic effects of this rate plan in PATH-Allegheny's financial istatements to maintain the comparability of financial information between entities. PATH-Allegheny requested and FERC approved as part of the February 29, 2008 Order a request to use footnote disclosures to report the economic effect of these rate incentives. Pursuant to the Tax Act, PATH-Allegheny remeasured its existing deferred income tax balances as of December 31, 2017, which resulted in a decrease to PATH-Allegheny's net deferred income tax liabilities. PATH-Allegheny recorded a corresponding net regulatory liability to the extent the change in deferred taxes would result in amounts previously collected from utility customers to be subject to refunds to such customers, generally through reductions in future rates.
As a result of the Tax Act, on December 31, 2017, PATH-Allegheny recorded a net decrease of \$2 million to its deferred income tax asset balance (FERC accounts 190 and 283) and a net regulatory asset of \$2 million (FERC account 182.3).
PATH-Allegheny adjusted its estimated provision for the 2017 tax year for return to provision adjustments during 2018, as well as the amount of excess and deficient deferred income taxes.
As of December 31, 2022, PATH-Alleghenry fully amortized the balance of the deficient deferred income tax regulatory asset.
The unprotected portion of the regulatory asset consisted of non-plant related net deficient deferred income taxes that were amortized using the Straight-line Method over a period ranging from 2 to 5 years, depending upon the underlying book-tax timing difference. As the deficient deferred income taxes reversed through the amortization periods discussed above, the net regulatory asset reversed with an offset to FERC income statement accounts 410.1. The amortized amounts have been re-deferred into FERC account 182.3.
